Message from the Principal

Winter appears to be here after several days of warmer weather. The recent snow and cool temperatures, that we knew would come at some point, are causing us all to bundle up a bit more. It is important for students to dress appropriately for the weather, complete with snow pants, winter jackets, boots, mitts and toques. Medications and/or Medical Treatment

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To keep our students and staff safe, strict Policies and Procedures are in place regarding medication and medical treatment at school for students. Sturgeon Public Schools recognizes that the administration of medication and/or medical treatment to students is the responsibility of parents, guardians and medical practitioners.

If a student must receive medication or medical treatment prescribed by a medical practitioner during the school day or during extra-curricular activities and the student is incapable of self-administration, the parent must request in writing to the Principal that the school store medication and medical treatment equipment to enable: student self-administration where appropriate (e.g. asthma inhalers); administration of medication and medical treatment. Written instructions must be signed by the parent/guardian and the physician. Non-prescribed medication shall not be distributed to any student enrolled in a Division school.

If you have any questions or concerns, please do not hesitate to contact the school. The Sturgeon Public School Division Policies and Procedures regarding Medication and Medical Treatment to Students can be found on our division website at https://www.sturgeon.ab.ca/board/procedures/4724.

As per Administrative Procedures II– School Board Governance and Operations, Section 255 Inclement Weather Decisions for Schools "The lowest temperature at which students will be required to go outside shall be -25 Degrees Celsius including wind chill and as determined by the Weather Network." Going forward, please ensure your child is appropriately dressed for the weather. Also, if you have extra hats and mittens, the school will greatly accept them to loan to those students in need.
