Welcome to November

We have been so lucky to have had such a long warm autumn season. As we welcome this new moon we will notice our weather begin to shift. Temperatures are dropping to below 0° overnight and we notice frost on the trees and grass in the mornings. This is our signal that colder weather is almost here to stay, and snow is just around the corner.

What is Frost?

Frost is water vapor that freezes and becomes a thin layer of ice.

Frosty Fun Facts

Did you know that there are several different types of frost?

The three most common are:

Hoar Frost —> When the frost grows overnight into long crystals of ice on the ground or other objects outside. It can also grow in freezers.

Advection Frost — A collection of small ice spikes that are formed when cold wind blows over tree branches or flag poles.

Window Frost —> Forms when a window is exposed to cold air outside, and warm moist air inside. We can find this on windows, and windshields.

Nature Challenge

Bundle up and get outside to enjoy the beautiful frosty mornings. Take your camera and try to find the three different types of frost.

Medications and/or Medical Treatment

To keep our students and staff safe, strict Policies and Procedures are in place regarding medication and medical treatment at school for students. Sturgeon Public Schools recognizes that the administration of medication and/or medical treatment to students is the responsibility of parents, guardians and medical practitioners.

If a student must receive medication or medical treatment prescribed by a medical practitioner during the school day or during extra-curricular activities and the student is incapable of self-administration, the parent must request in writing to the Principal that the school store medication and medical treatment equipment to enable: student self-administration where appropriate (e.g. asthma inhalers); administration of medication and medical treatment. Written instructions must be signed by the parent/guardian and the physician. Non-prescribed medication shall not be distributed to any student enrolled in a Division school.
