

Outcome-based reporting centers on the actual Learning outcomes provided by Alberta Education and your child's progress in meeting these outcomes; there is no explicit focus on reporting individual assignments. This approach offers parents a more comprehensive and nuanced understanding of their child's educational journey. 805: Assessment, Evaluation and Reporting Student Achievement

Sturgeon Public Schools believes that fair and just practices for accurate assessment, evaluation and reporting of student achievement in relation to <u>Alberta Learning outcomes</u> form an essential component of a quality educational system.

Key Vocabulary:

<u>Assessment</u>- refers to the process of collecting, interpreting, and communicating information about a student's progress in relation to the learning outcomes.

<u>Evaluation</u> - is judgment about the student's level of understanding or performance of learning outcomes based on evidence gathered from a variety of assessment methods.

<u>Reporting</u>- refers to communication of student achievement; this is done through PowerSchool Gradebook

<u>Academic Achievement Scale:</u> A numerical scale that corresponds to the level of achievement a child has attained pertaining to the learning outcome as set out by Alberta Education.

The Academic Achievement Scales for Kindergarten to Grade 4 are included in this newsletter. These scales are what your child's teachers are using to assess, evaluate, and report on your child's progress toward meeting the learning outcomes.
