Did you know?

• STAR Program - The STAR (Social Emotional Learning, Targeted Skills, Accountable for our actions, Relationships and restorative practice) program is designed to foster a safe and positive playground. The program offers students the chance to strengthen their sense of community within their house leagues while showcasing how they are Outstanding Wise Leaders. Once a month at lunch recess, students join their team to help develop and practice various skills such as making new friends, conflict resolution and sportsmanship.



• What is P.L.C.? - P.L.C. stands for Professional Learning Community. At Ochre Park School, homeroom teachers have 60 minutes of PLC time built into their weekly timetable. During this meeting time, teachers work with our Learning Coach and Administrators on different items, for example, analyzing student work, to inform our practice with the overarching goal of improving student achievement. While homeroom teachers are collaborating, Little Owls work with Mrs. Larson, Mr. Chris, and Ms. Moores on outcomes tied to our Physical Education and Wellness Curriculum, including outdoor education.

1. Sturgeon Public School Division Holiday Card


